

## MERCER COUNTY COURT HOUSE

The County of Mercer was established March 12, 1800 and named after Revolutionary War Brigadier General Hugh Mercer.

The Mercer County Court House, a symbol of endurance and strength of its county government and agents of justice, was dedicated October 12, 1911.

Dominating the skyline in and about Mercer Borough, the Court House was built on the concept of incorporating design and decoration to create a beautiful edifice of stately dignity.

It represents not only the spirit of the system of justice and government, but the sweat and toil of the people who built it then and those who maintain it today.

Representing 48 municipalities in the County, three cities, 14 boroughs and 31 townships, it is a privilege and an honor to be a part of history in the making by serving as a Commissioner of Mercer County.
