More books need to be pub on the shelves — the new library can hold 75 percent more than the old. A lower-level bookstore must be completed. The bookstore and the county's first library cafe, which will open with the library, will be privately operated but will generate income for the library. The first Poland Library, dedicated more than 66 years ago, was located in a small room in the Poland Town Hall and held 1,377 books. The new library comprises 35.619 square feet and was designed to hold a collection of 70,000 lems. In the most recent Poland Library, 15 patrons could seem like a crowd. The new facility includes a meeting room that seats 300 — as well as plenty of room for readers. And readers — young and old — are those for whom free libraries are established. In the new Foland Library, the cause of literacy has been advanced magnificently.
